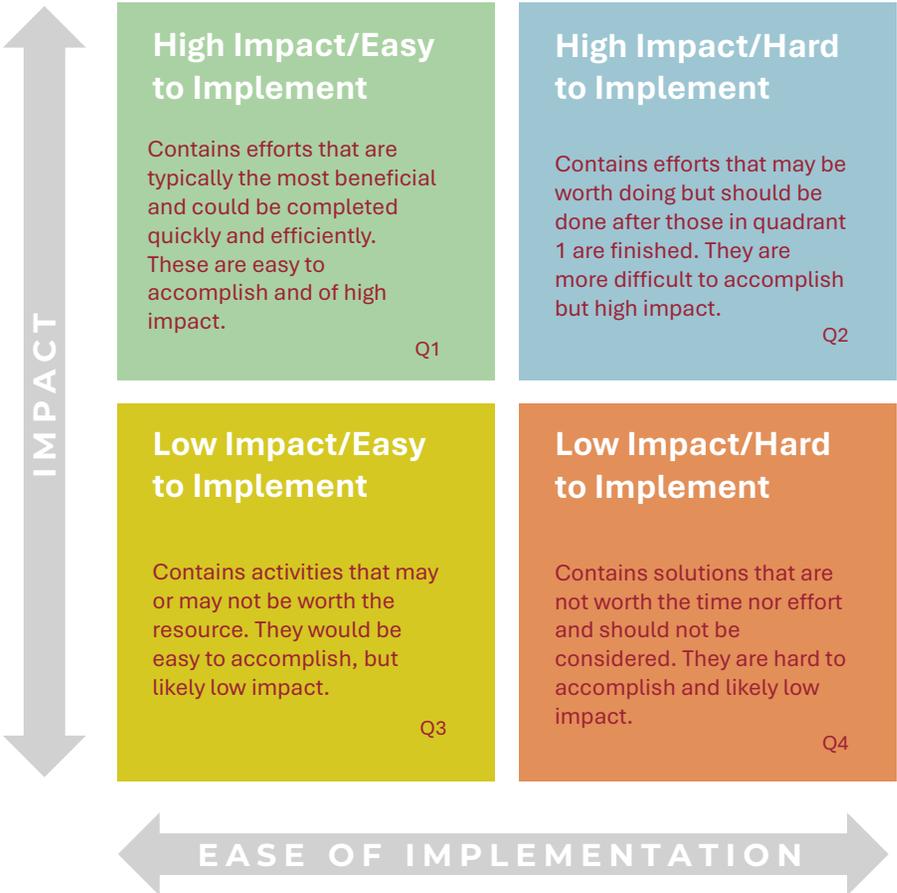

One component of the Sustainability Planning Project was to conduct a feasibility activity with the project advisors. This activity explored the feasibility of implementation for the eight identified sustainability pathways across two domains: ease of implementation (how easy or hard this would be to accomplish) and impact if implemented (how beneficial would this be). Project advisors were provided a 4 square matrix and asked via survey to assign a quadrant to each of the eight categories. Twenty-six advisors provided feedback. The following is a summary of feedback received for each of the pathways.

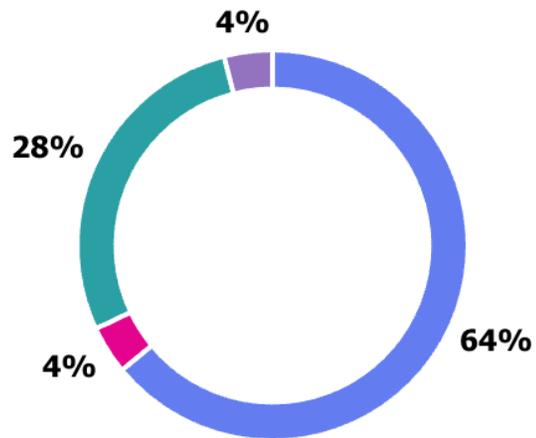
General

- All pathways should consider diversity of race, age and ability as well as cultural considerations.

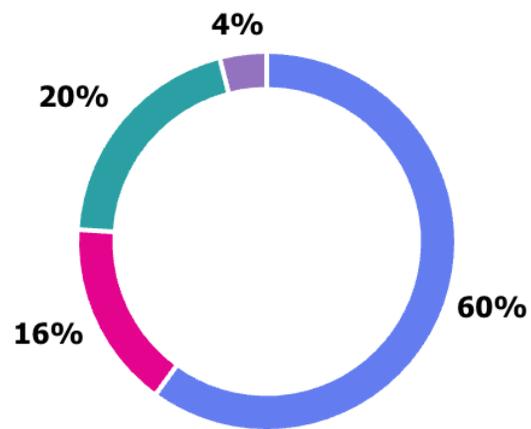

- Sustainability of funding

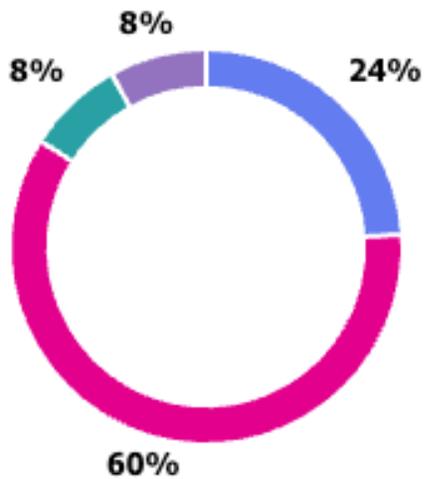
Planning Tools

- Should cover a range of needs from physical, emotional, housing and financial.

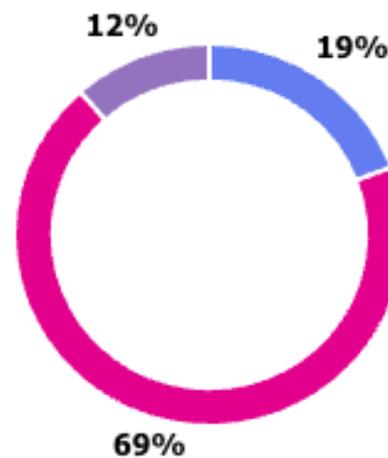

- Provide emotional support/ coaching model
- Concern having CCS do this work- additional burden
- Crucial to have knowledgeable consultants trained to access and deliver diverse, culturally appropriate guidance

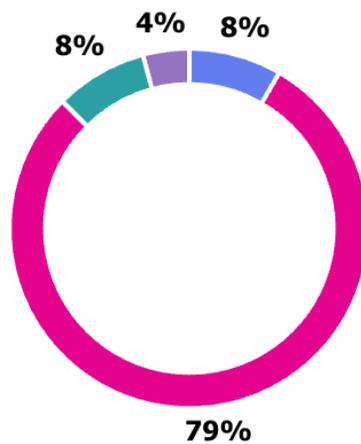
Back Up Supports

- There is no apparent funding mechanism
- Consider a systems approach to pay, coordinate and train
- Concern about staff quality – random staff will not have training on specific individual needs
- Some use existing staff and a backup plan

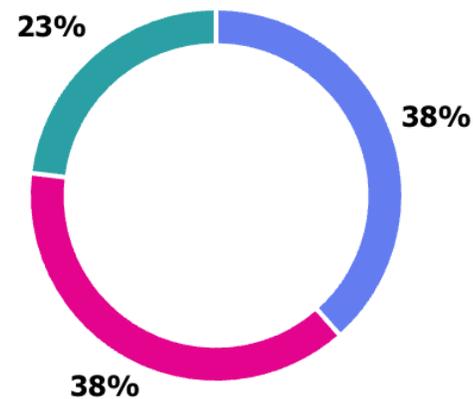

- Are we talking how to pay for the house or the physical layout of the housing unit?

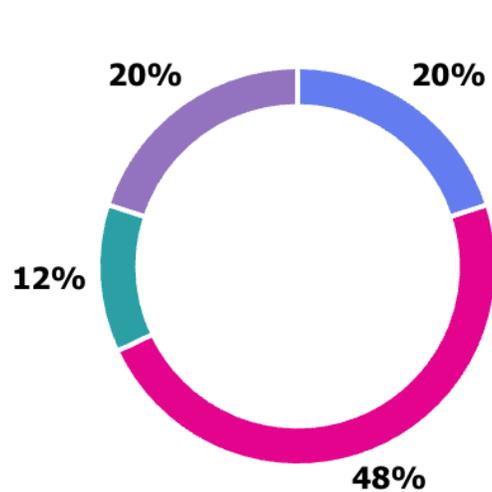
Training for Future Caregivers

- Onboard future caregivers before transition happens
- Partner with local organizations
- Value would depend on quality of training

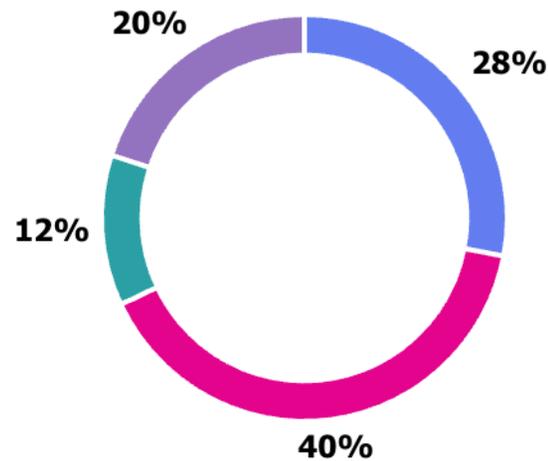

Enhanced Case Worker

- Many questions /concern
- Potential conflict of interest for CCSs
- Existing high CCS turnover (high case loads/low pay)
- Current case managers (CCS's) would need to be better trained, workloads reduced
- One case worker for all services (REM, Waiver, CFC)
- Need for cultural competency training

Pooled Resources

- Lack of clarity about this pathway
- Sharing resources could be away to efficiently use limited resources
